CAN YOUR THOUGHTS BETRAY YOU?

I am starting with a rhetorical question because the answer is certainly yes. Paul writes to the Christian Church at Corinth with these following words.

⁵Examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Do you not know yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?—unless indeed you are disqualified. ⁶But I trust that you will know that we are not disqualified. **2 Corinthians 13:5–6 (NKJV)**

Now this is a very heavy statement, but the context of the text comes after a tremendous amount of groundwork which has been done. We have recently introduced and are preparing to launch The CCN (Care Connection Network). I believe that we need to perform what Paul is encouraging the Believers to do in Corinth, "examine yourselves." I believe this is critical and key to having a healthy mind, spirit and ultimately a healthy life.

At our special Town Hall Meeting, Dr. McMillian encouraged us to reach out when you see that your thoughts are being challenged. For the record, I would like to state that being challenged mentally and seeking help for it does not disqualify you as a Christian. I believe it is the exact opposite.

Below, I am listing the eight main reasons why you should seek help if you are experiencing any of the following:

- 1. You're not feeling "like yourself" lately.
- 2. You've gone through a major life change.
- 3. You've experienced a traumatic event.
- 4. You're having thoughts of suicide/self-harm.
- 5. Others have expressed concerns about you.
- 6. An important relationship is in trouble.
- 7. You've developed compulsive behavior(s).
- 8. You have become dependent on drugs or alcohol.

Please make self-care an important item on your agenda.

Midshipman André Cam'ryn Xavier Rascoe, Jr., (or Cam as his family calls him) is the grandson of Elder Minister Minnie Rascoe. André graduated May 27, 2022 as the President of his US Naval Academy class. The average GPA for the Academy is 4.3 and the acceptance rate is 8 to 10 percent. Nomination to the US Naval Academy is required by a member of Congress. In Cam's case, he was nominated by Congressman Bobby Scott from Virginia.

Cam originally intended to pursue a law degree and become a Naval JAG Officer. However, he discovered a love for Nuclear Engineering and will now be an Officer on a US Navy Nuclear Submarine. While navigating his rigorous physical and academic program, which included Physics, Advanced Mathematics and Applied Thermodynamics, Cam also found time to spearhead and organize Black Studies events at the Academy.

Cam also pursued his love for singing with the Naval Academy Concert Choir. He was honored to sing at the funeral service of Senator John McCain. Cam then became a vocal soloist with the Naval Academy Gospel Choir and was honored to sing with gospel great Marvin Sapp. Additionally, during Military Appreciation Day, Cam proudly represented the Naval Academy by singing the National Anthem at a televised Baltimore Orioles baseball game.

Cam also found time to become a lead performer with the Naval Academy Performing Arts Department, starring in the musicals Little Shop of Horrors, Oklahoma and Grease. Finally, Cam used his summers to train at Quantico Marine Base to become a Jiu Jitsu instructor while on the Winning Naval Academy Jiu Jitsu Team, The Raptors.

As the President of his 2022 class, Cam was designated to acquire and present a gift to US President Joe Biden, in order to thank President Biden for providing the Commencement Address to the graduates. Cam also provided his Presidential Speech to his fellow graduates. In his address, Cam gave honor to his Great-Grandfather, a share cropper, and his daughter, Minister Rascoe, for instilling the legacy and life-lesson of valuing the "the importance of early mornings during the Harvest Season." This is a practice Cam remembers witnessing in his Grandma's prayer life. He attributes her heritage of "early mornings" to his successes.






