I'M COOL WITH YOU CALLING ME CHILDISH

Scriptures: Micah 7:18-19 (NIV) – (Old Testament) – ¹⁸Who is a God like you, who pardons sin and forgives the transgression of the remnant of his inheritance? You do not stay angry forever but delight to show mercy. ¹⁹You will again have compassion on us; you will tread our sins underfoot and hurl all our iniquities into the depths of the sea. (Better known to us as the Sea of Forgetfulness.)

Matthew $18:2-3 - (New Testament) - {}^{2}He$ called a little child to Him, and placed the child among them. {}^{3}And he said: "Truly I tell you, unless you change and become like little children, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

Throughout life we have all heard the terms "grow up," "act your age" and "you're acting immature." Those terms were normally hurled at us by adult family members or authority figures when we did things that were not age appropriate. Most of us would agree that hearing those terms either made us angry or we took steps to change our bad behavior. However, in certain circumstances, **"I'm cool with you calling me childish'**.

On July 31, 2015, my wife and I met a little 4 year-old boy who would eventually become our adopted son. At that time, I was 47 years old. Once this little boy came into my life, I immediately thought about all the things that I could teach this young impressionable human. I pondered the things that I was taught throughout my life by a host of family members and friends. Fast forward about a month, my great plans and ideas were quickly dashed. I thought God put me and this child together for me to teach him how to act, but God had a totally different plan. During the last almost 8 years this child has taught me so many things. I would like to discuss one of the most important things that this young man taught me. That one thing is forgiving immediately and moving on.

There have been so many occasions that I can't count how many times this little boy has made me so angry I was breathing fire. I would discipline and chastise him for his wrongdoings then I would be mad about the situation. A few minutes later or maybe an hour later this little boy would come hug me and say, in a sweet innocent voice like he had not just done a horrible thing and say "I LOVE YOU Daddy" or "Daddy do you want to watch a movie or play a game with me?" Mind you I'm still fuming with smoke coming out of my ears and this child has forgiven me and he has moved on. If I act like my son when it comes to forgiving and moving on, "I'm cool with you calling me childish".

This child has the ability to forgive me for disciplining and chastising him, but here I am still upset. At first, I thought is this child using reverse psychology on me with the hug and saying "I love you," or wanting to play a game or watch a movie. Then one day it hit me, here is a 4 year-old child who forgives immediately and moves on. At the same time, I was a 47 year-old man who couldn't forgive immediately and move on. God revealed to me that you're 47 years old, you still sin daily by thought, word and deed, but you expect a 4 year-old child not to mess up. God forgives us immediately and moves on so we should be able to do the same thing with our fellow humans.

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Our Old Testament scripture, *Micah 7:18-19*, point blank describes our relationship with God. We sin, He forgives and He forgets immediately. In other words, we mess up, He says its alright and He moves on. God doesn't stay angry with us. As a child my son had already developed the ability to forgive immediately and move on, I pray he continues to be that way. Again, **"I'm cool with you calling me childish'** if I'm imitating my son.

The New Testament scripture simply states, sometimes we must adjust and be like children. Being humble and not allowing your anger to continue is a great attribute that children have mastered. Children can be playing, then fighting and then back to playing before we know it. I'll reiterate, **"I'm cool with you calling me childish"**.

If You Can't Say Sumptin' Nice

"Pleasant words are like a honeycomb, Sweetness to the soul and health to the bones." – Proverbs 16:24 (NKJV)

Truth be told, my family tends to joke around a lot. We are always jabbing and poking with words, not in malice but in jest. I am learning though that such communication holds tiny prongs that stick in the heart of others. It seems innocent at first until someone's feelings get hurt. We insist we were only kidding and just having fun. I think sometimes the enemy convinces us that anything in fun is okay, but if it is at the expense of another is it really okay?

Kind words are like honey.

Our words hold power. They are established by the Breath of God that runs through every single human being ever created – believer or not. When we speak something enough – it will happen.

Have you ever said the wrong thing at the wrong time? Sometimes we ignore the filter and say things that hurt, offend or are not uplifting. It's not intentional. It just comes out. I think many of us are guilty of poorly chosen words or of saying the wrong thing at the wrong time. How many of us have heard the saying, "Sticks and stones may break my bones, but words can never hurt me?" Some of our parents tried to encourage us with those words. We have even said those words to our children. However, it is a lie – period. Words do hurt. *Proverbs 18:21* says "*DEATH and LIFE is in the power of the tongue*." In the book of *James 8:3* it says "*but no man can tame the tongue*. It is an unruly EVIL, full of deadly poison."

So, you may ask, then how am I expected to mind my tongue if the word says I can't even tame it? Well, I'm glad you asked. One day we WILL be held accountable for every "idle" word that we speak (*Matthew 12:36*) including those we did not mean or when we were only kidding around. I do believe that God looks at the intent of our hearts when we say such things but I also believe that we must be accountable for our words and THAT begins in our hearts. In order to keep our tongues in check, we must pray daily that our hearts be purified. God will grant us a tender, compassionate, kind, caring, giving heart – the heart of Jesus.

Although we will never tame our tongue, we can learn to control it and use it better. We have a choice in the words we use each and every day. Some are spoken in the heat of the moment while others are well thought out. No matter when, what, or how we say something, once those words leave our mouths, they are out there in the atmosphere. It's very important that we choose wisely.

My Mom would tell us to mind what we say to each other because if you can't say sumptin' nice, don't say nuttin' at all. She would tell us don't say anything you will regret because we cannot take it back. Once it's released, you can never retract it. I can remember hearing say what you mean and mean what you say. In other words, don't say something that you have to ask for forgiveness for later. When you are mad, consider your words carefully. When you make a promise, think about it first. Words are important. They are the glue that binds relationships or the stones that tear them down.

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The hard part is not the forgiving--it's the forgetting or the letting go. I can forgive what you said to me time and time again but I cannot forget the words you spoke to me. It may not reside in the penthouse of my mind but it is there in the subbasement; lying dormant until the next time.

The words of our mouths give evidence of the contents of our hearts. Words do hurt other people. They can kill a relationship. The greatest commandment is to love one another. We must protect our connection with the people in our lives. God has called us to love even our enemies. Our hearts should project love in our words along with our actions.

Our job in this life is to bless others. Never curse them or cause them distress. We should be agreeable, sympathetic, loving, compassionate and humble which means even when someone does not show us the same respect – we keep doing what our Father has shown us. No exceptions and no retaliation.

Be a blessing...get a blessing.

God has given us great power when we asked His Son to be our Lord and Savior. We must use our words effectively and responsibly. Our words can CHANGE today and BUILD a better tomorrow. They can BREAK generational curses and MAKE lasting relationships.

It is important to speak kind words to others. It is also important to surround yourself with the kind of people who will speak kind words to you!

Look, we can't be people whose mouths are instructed by our culture, our own selfish motives or by Satan who would love to use our mouths for his own destructive purposes. Let us be people with the grace-filled, love-overflowing, lifeencouraging, Spirit-instructed mouth! Let us embrace hearing what our hearts have to say about what words we should use. As we listen to this soul-nourishing instruction for our mouths, may we submit our hearts to be ruled and governed by the Holy Spirit of God. May God's instructions dominate our conversations, statements and answers so that others may be blessed. Over the last few months, I have experienced what I refer to as a low grade depression. Nothing was wrong, but everything seemed wrong. I was busy trying to manage teaching and mothering post pandemic. I was tired, drained emotionally and mentally. Taking in the sorrows of this world depleted. I was spiritually dehydrated. Water is vital to human life. Most of the human body is an average of about 60 percent water.

Water:

- Regulates body temperature
- Moistens tissues in the eyes, nose and mouth
- Protects body organs and tissues
- Carries nutrients and oxygen to cells
- Lubricates joints
- Lessens burden on the kidneys and liver by flushing out waste products
- Dissolves minerals and nutrients to make them accessible to your body

Water is vital to life. It is necessary for the proper functioning of every organ in the body. As such, your body has a way to signal to you when you are in need of water - thirst. In the natural, thirst is the desire to drink fluid. It is one of the body's ways of maintaining a healthy level of fluids. The level of thirst indicates that you need more or less fluid. Physical thirst patterns change based on your level of activity and diet. Major changes in thirst (excessive thirst or lack of thirst) may signal a disease or medical condition. Typically, by the time you feel thirsty you are in the beginning stages of dehydration.

Dehydration occurs when the amount of water leaving the body is greater than the amount being consumed. In addition to thirst, the symptoms of dehydration include, but are not limited to:

- blurred vision
- confusion
- fever
- chills
- malaise
- unexplained agitation
- nausea

Many parallels can be made between natural and spiritual thirst. Spiritually, thirst is the longing or desire for a connection with God. As water is vital for life in the physical man, so is a connection with God vital for the life of the spirit man. This symbolism is seen often throughout Scripture. In *Psalm 42:1*, the comparison is made between the deer panting at the brook and the man's very soul panting after, longing for and desiring the presence of God. When Jesus encounters the Samaritan woman at the well, He promises that if you drink the water that He offers you will never thirst again. That thirst is a longing, an emptiness that is found in the soul of every man until he is reconciled back to God through Christ Jesus.

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Spiritual thirst may also be experienced in the redeemed when we allow ourselves to be separated from God and the things of His Kingdom. I believe we see this in the fifth of the seven last words when Jesus, hanging on the cross, says "I thirst." Although He is not operating outside of God's plans or His will, He is, at that moment, feeling disconnected from God. His crying out "Why have You forsaken me?" shows that He did not feel a connection with or the presence of God.

Sin and disobedience separate us from God to be sure, but so does the busyness of life. The scriptures say that Jesus was given vinegar or sour wine in response. While the Bible says this was done in order that prophecy might be fulfilled, this also speaks to the insufficiency of what the world offers. Though Jesus' thirst indicates a need for fluids, the fluid that was given would rob his body of hydration and make Him even more thirsty. Vinegar is a diuretic. By design it removes fluids from the body. While at first blush, being a fluid it would seem to meet the need. Thirst is a desire for fluid. Vinegar is a fluid. However, the nature of this particular fluid makes it impossible to satisfy thirst. It may meet the immediate need for moisture on a parched tongue. However, its nature is to remove moisture from the body, thus increasing not satisfy thirst.

The same can be said for all the things that are used as substitutes for the living water. No drug, drink, man, woman, toy, measure of wealth, level of power or degree of success – *nothing* – can fulfill that longing, that thirst for God. Like liquid on a parched tongue, they may provide immediate, yet temporary relief. They appear to quench the thirst. However, the very nature, purpose and design of what the world offers is likened to a spiritual diuretic. It will only further separate you from God – His will, plans and purpose. What the world offers can only create a greater void and a deeper longing.

This truth is seen most dramatically in addicts. When an addict first begins using a drug, he feels euphoric. Over time the same drug in the same quantity has little or no effect. Either more of the drug or a new more powerful drug must be used to get the same exuberant feeling. Soon the addict is chasing a feeling he no longer receives. His longing is greater; the desire is deeper. Yet, satisfaction is elusive.

Hold one, I hear you thinking that this doesn't apply to you because you don't drink or do drugs. That doesn't mean you're not addicted. What did Solange say? I'll paraphrase. You've tried to drink it away, smoke it away, buy it away, sex it away, sleep it away, work it away, mean it away, lie it away, hide it away, dress it away, to no avail. It is the nature of the "sour-wine" offered by this world. It cannot, will not, is not intended to soothe the soul or satisfy the spirit.

The more you drink of the "sour wine" that the world offers, the more spiritually dehydrated you will become. As things in nature often mimic or parallel things of the spirit, the symptoms of spiritual dehydration are similar to those of natural dehydration. Vision may become blurred. Lies begin to look like truth. Confusion may take hold. Confusion is defined as a loss of the sense of time, place and identity or to be displaced from normal position or relationship.

When God is removed from His proper place, it is impossible for man to truly know who He is. Confusion sets in. You are displaced from the normal (intended) position or relationship. We see this in the parable of the prodigal son. Since he has forsaken his proper position and relationship with his father, in his confusion, he chooses to dine among swine. In his confusion, he is unable to appreciate the provision, protection and pleasures of his father's palace.

Malaise is another symptom of dehydration. Malaise is a vague sense of physical or mental uneasiness, an unidentified sense of illness. Nothing seems quite right. Nothing satisfies. Nothing soothes. Apart from God, everything is vanity.

Streams of water or flowing water symbolize God's spirit. John 7:37-39 states: "On the last day, that great day of the feast, Jesus stood and cried, saying, If any man thirst, let him come unto Me, and drink. He who believes in Me, as the scripture hath said, out of his heart will flow rivers of living water." When we are reconciled with the Holy Father through Christ Jesus, we receive His Holy Spirit. That void, the emptiness of soul and spirit are filled with His Holy Spirit. However, it is a daily undertaking. We must be intentional about refreshing our spirit routinely, regularly and consistently to allow the living waters to flow over, in and through us. It is vital to life and spiritual living. It is the only way that we will be able to provide living waters for this dry and thirsty land.

Let's Eat – Strawberry Recipes

Strawberry Tiramisu



YIELD PR Serves 9

PREP TIME COOK TIME 1 hrs. 0 mins.

Ingredients

Strawberry Jam

4 cups quartered strawberries 600 grams 1 cup granulated sugar 200 grams

Strawberry Syrup

1/3 cup strawberry jam1 cup strawberry liqueur read notes for substitution

Mascarpone Filling

- 2 cups mascarpone cheese 452 grams
- 1/2 cup powdered sugar divided (62.5 grams)
- 3 tbsp lemon juice 45 ml
- 1 tsp pure vanilla extract
- 1 3/4 cup heavy whipping cream very cold, 420 ml

To Assemble

3/4 cup chopped strawberries 112 grams

28 ladyfinger cookies

For the top

1/2 cup whipping cream very cold1 cup freeze dried strawberries 28 grams

Directions

Strawberry Jam

- 1. Add the chopped strawberries, sugar, and lemon juice to a saucepan.
- 2. Cook the strawberries, stirring occasionally, at mediumhigh heat.
- 3. When the strawberries come to a boil, turn the heat down and continue to cook at medium-low heat.
- 4. Cook until a thermometer reads between 200° and 220°F. The jam will be dark and thick. If it starts to stick to the bottom of the pan, turn the heat down even lower.

This delicious Strawberry Tiramisu is brimming with strawberry flavor! It has layers of fluffy ladyfingers dipped in strawberry syrup, topped with the creamy Mascarpone Filling, Strawberry Jam, and chopped strawberries.

- 5. If you don't have a thermometer, simply stop cooking the jam once it is dark and thick.
- 6. Remove the jam to a bowl, place a piece of plastic wrap directly on the surface of the jam and let it cool down. Refrigerate for a couple of hours before using.

Mascarpone Filling

- 1. In a large bowl, beat the mascarpone cheese with 1/4 cup of powdered sugar, the lemon juice and the vanilla extract using an electric mixer at medium speed. The mascarpone can be straight from the fridge, no need to let it become softened. Beat just until combined. Set aside.
- 2. In another bowl, whip the cold heavy whipping cream with the remaining 1/4 cup of powdered sugar for 2 to 3 minutes, or until slightly stiff peaks form. Don't over whip.
- 3. Add half of the whipped cream to the mascarpone and fold to combine.
- 4. Then add the remaining half of the whipped cream and fold again.

Strawberry Syrup

- 1. Mix the jam and the liqueur (or juice if substituting). Whisk until combined. Set aside.
- 2. You can use strawberry juice, orange juice, or Grand Marnier instead of strawberry liqueur.

To assemble

- 1. I used a 9×9" pan. You can use a 8×8" pan, or a 11×6". You can use smaller pans if you have more than one.
- 2. Dip each ladyfinger in the Strawberry Syrup, and lay them on the bottom of the pan one next to the other.
- 3. Top the ladyfingers with half of the Mascarpone Filling. Use a small offset spatula to spread the filling evenly.
- 4. Drizzle about 1/2 cup of jam on top of the mascarpone. If the jam is too thick and not spreading easily, simply add a bit of water or strawberry liqueur until the jam has a spreading consistency.
- 5. Sprinkle chopped strawberries evenly on top of the jam.
- 6. Now make another layer of ladyfingers on top of the chopped strawberries.
- 7. Dip each ladyfinger in the syrup and place on top of the layered dessert. Push down gently on the cookies as you place them on top of the strawberries.
- 8. Top the cookies with the remaining half of the Mascarpone Filling.
- 9. Let the tiramisu sit in the fridge overnight.

To serve

- 1. Before serving, make the whipped cream for the top. Simply whip the heavy cream for a couple of minutes at mediumhigh speed, or until stiff peaks form. Place it in a piping bag. This is optional, you only have to top the tiramisu with whipped cream if you wish to do so. You can get creative and do a different decoration.
- 2. Pulse the freeze dried strawberries in a small food processor until they become a fine powder.
- 3. Sift the freeze dried strawberry powder on top of the tiramisu. Pipe whipped cream around the edges, and top with fresh strawberries if desired.
- 4. Slice and serve.

Storage

This Strawberry Tiramisu will store well in the fridge for up to 3 days.

Recipe Notes

Strawberry liqueur: You can substitute the strawberry liqueur for orange juice, strawberry juice or other types of liqueur such as Grand Marnier which is an orange liqueur.

Balsamic vinegar: add about 2 teaspoons of balsamic vinegar to the strawberry syrup if desired, the tangy flavor of the vinegar goes really well with the sweet strawberry.

Ladyfinger cookies: the amount you will need might depend on the size of the pan you are using.

Pan size: I used a 9×9 " pan. You can use a 8×8 " pan, or a 11×6 ". You can use smaller pans if you have more than one. One batch of this recipe can be divided between two 6×6 " pans.

Strawberry jam: you can use store-bought if you don't want to make your own jam, it will turn out just as delicious!

Mascarpone cheese: you can substitute it for cream cheese, but it simply won't be as light, it will be more dense. Also, you have to make sure the cream cheese is softened when using it in the recipe, while the mascarpone doesn't have to be.

Recipe twists: add a bit of orange zest or lemon zest to the mascarpone filling to brighten up the mixture.

Sweet Southern Strawberry Iced Tea

10 mins.



YIELD Serves 12 PREP TIME Control 10 mins.

Ingredients

10 cups water (divided)

6 family-size teabags

1 cup granulated sugar (or to taste)

juice of 1 lemon

About 12 large strawberries, cleaned and chopped

Small strawberries, for serving (optional)

Sweet tea is a staple in the south. Not only do most southerners know how to brew the perfect pot of sweet tea, but they know how to make it even more special by adding fruit. This sweet strawberry iced tea recipe is what to serve at your next summer get-together, party or holiday like Memorial Day, Labor Day or July 4th. Or today, just because.

Directions

- 1. Bring 3 cups of water to a boil in a small pot. Add the tea bags, turn off the heat and let it steep 10 minutes. Remove the teabags, add the sugar and stir to dissolve.
- 2. Put the strawberries into a blender or food processor and puree.
- 3. Put 7 cups of water into a drink pitcher. Add the sweetened tea, stir and add the strawberry puree and lemon juice. Stir. Serve over ice with additional strawberries in the glass.

Recipe Notes

Try this fruit-flavored iced tea recipe with other berries like raspberries, blackberries and blueberries.

Adjust the sugar to fit your tastes. If you're concerned about the amount of sugar, start with 1/4 cup and add more as needed.
