

Quavo, a member of the group Migos, sang the hook; which is also the title, "Walk It Like I Talk It" referencing the idiom "talk the talk and walk the walk". In other words, perform in practice what you've claimed verbally.

I was reminded of this one Sunday when I logged on to the *Greater St. John* online service and there was no sound. I didn't hear the opening, the praise team and only a smidgen of the Bishop. Then reading all of the chat messages that clearly outlined confusion; you would think one would just log off. If I can be transparent, I thought about it and I had no judgement towards others if they did. However, for some reason, I just couldn't hit that little x in the top right corner. I sat in my home and watched a service online that I could not hear in its entirety. I know that some of you might be thinking, "Well, what did you get out of that?" That would be a legitimate question. This is my response.

When I looked at the screen, I didn't just see a man talking that I couldn't hear. I saw Bishop changing his facial expressions to communicate the points he was trying to make, pointing or reaching out to the screen so the online audience would know he was connecting with them, and widening his eyes so that those watching would get the idea of what was about to happen that we didn't want to miss. While I heard nothing, I saw excitement and passion for something I couldn't physically see.

When I looked at the screen, I didn't just see people singing a few songs. I saw the Praise Team singing, lifting hands, crying out, moving their bodies in ways that only the spirit could inspire. While I heard nothing, I saw adoration, appreciation and love for something that I could not physically see.

When I looked at the screen, I didn't just see a woman standing behind a pulpit talking. I saw Minister Samaria showcasing a little "Black Girl Magic" doing her little rhythmic bounce with a hint of neck roll; like only she can, sending a message that she is serious about whatever she's saying and that what she's saying is important. While I heard nothing, I saw confidence, preparedness and appeal; someone making a serious and urgent request about something I couldn't physically see.

In all of those scenarios, I was eager to know; "what are they saying?", because, remember, I couldn't hear the service at all. Then the Holy Spirit spoke and said to me, it doesn't matter in this moment what they're saying. I just want to remind you that "The way you act and live your life should create the same eagerness in others to want to know what's motivating your actions and decision to follow Me; as the people on the screen's actions are motivating you."

James 1:22 tells us "But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves." I believe that James makes this request because he knows that people are watching, and actions speak louder than words. People are more likely to do what you do before they'll do what you say. Back in the day you would hear parents say all the time, "Do as I say and not as I do." That worked back in the day. However, New Age Parents, with New Age Children know all too well that the depth of your influence goes so much deeper when you DO what you're asking them to do - not just telling them what to do.

The love, knowledge and power of God can't be contained. *Jeremiah* said "it's like fire shut up in my bones." When you can't say or hear a word, the outward expression of the inner works manifest itself in such a way that, like the jailor with Paul and Silas, and me on Sunday; people become desperate to know what they can do to have what you have because of what they've seen God do through you. It's in demonstrating your love and appreciation for God that peaks interest and opens the door for you to share God's love.

It's so amazing that God uses us to communicate His message through both word and deed. You see, what you say can indicate what you believe. However, what you do indicates the depth of value you place on what you believe. In addition to the sun and the moon, night and day, water and land; you and I are proof that God lives.

If we are going to invoke the same eagerness, excitement and urgency that I felt, wanting to know desperately what was being said during this service that I was watching and couldn't hear; and why these people were doing what they were doing; we can't just "Talk It". We've got to "Walk It Like We Talk It."

I know it has been quite some time since I have sent an update on my journey. So much has gone on. I am in the recovery stage of the chemo treatments I completed on January 22. On January 31, I was rushed to the hospital for low blood pressure. I stayed in the hospital for five days and received a blood transfusion. With any illness, you have to be aware of what your body can and can't do. You have to be sure to drink fluids every hour and a half to get all of that chemo out of your system and be sure to eat healthy snacks in between meals. I have lost so much weight I am trying to eat EVERYTHING just to get the pounds back on...LOL. I went from 157 to 108 pounds. I have good and bad days, but I must admit my good days outweigh the bad.

My trust in God has increased so much. Believe me, there were days when my faith was the size of a mustard seed. However, I never questioned why this was happening I just said "God I need you - I know you are here with me, just continue to give me strength. I know that you have brought me through things that I never saw my way out of before and I know that you will do it again." A mustard seed is enough because He will show up and show out more than you can ever imagine.

It has taken me quite some time to gather my thoughts for this article because God has been blessing me so much. I am in awe of his amazing power. Sometimes I can't even find the words to put together to share the goodness of his work, but I brought you on this journey with me because I know it will help someone who may not believe. You must have hope that God will make a way out of no way! You must constantly tell yourself – "Lord, I trust you," and He will guide your footsteps, but you have to be willing to be in a quiet place and listen.

During this journey I made sure to spend at least 30 minutes a day of reading the Bible and studying His Word because, at the end of the day, that is what will carry you wherever you need to go. I made sure I spent time with God thanking Him for this journey and trusting Him along the way. I never questioned the journey, I just kept telling myself Lord I trust you. Your way is better than mine. I knew without time spent with Him, my prayer warriors who continuously prayed for me and the genuine love shown to me, I couldn't have done this. Ok, I'm about to go into preacher mode and that isn't the purpose of this article. I feel compelled to share my true testimony with the world.

I needed to have a full-body PET scan. This scan will show if there are any cancer cells in the entire body. The scariest part of this test was the noise the machine makes. Also, if you are claustrophobic, then that might be a problem. Well, I went to sleep. If you tell me I can't move, that is what I do. The test took about 45 minutes. I also had an MRI of the brain because, if you remember from the beginning, there were three small tumors in my head. The scariest part of this MRI (with contrast) was the noise of the machine. I had earplugs and headphones with music playing and off to sleep I went.

My Oncologist gave me the test results. Family, I am in REMISSION. ALL CANCER CELLS ARE GONE! HALLELUJAH!!! PRAISE DANCE IN FULL EFFECT...MOVING MY BODY FOR REAL!!!! GOD did it! From this point on, I have one more MRI to do and I will continue appointments with my oncologist every three months, then every 6 months and finally once a year.

What's next you ask? Speaking engagements, interviews, wherever God leads me. I officially retired from PGCPS after 31 years. Most importantly, I beat cancer!

Let's Eat - Recipe

Garlic Herb Butter Roast Chicken



Prep Time: 10 mins

Cook Time: 1 hr 15 mins

Servings: 4

Ingredients

4 pound (2kg) whole chicken, at room temperature giblets and neck removed from cavity*

1/4 cup unsalted butter, melted

3 tablespoons olive oil

1/4 cup white wine, (OPTIONAL) -- use a dry wine like a Sauv blanc or Chardonnay

1 lemon, halved

Salt and freshly ground pepper, to taste

2 tablespoons fresh chopped parsley

4 garlic cloves, minced

1 head of garlic roughly peeled and cut in half horizontally through the middle crosswise

3 fresh whole rosemary sprigs

Note:

For a larger chicken, roast at 430°F (220°C), 0r 400°F (200°C) fan forced, for one hour. Then, reduce oven temperature down to 325 (160°C). Baste and cover chicken. Roast, basting 2 more times while cooking, until chicken is cooked through, about 45 mins to an hour. Internal temperature should read 165°F (75° C) and juices run clear when pierced.

Garlic Herb Butter Roast Chicken nothing beats an easy to make and even easier to prepare roast chicken! Especially when roasted with garlic butter, rosemary, parsley, lemon, and a hint of white wine for an unbeatable flavour. This Garlic Herb Butter Roast Chicken definitely beats the pants off of any rotisserie chicken!

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 430°F | 220°C (400°F or 200°C fan forced). Line a baking tray with foil, or lightly grease a roasting pan.
- 2. Discard neck from inside the cavity and remove any excess fat and leftover feathers. Pat dry with paper towels.
- Pour the olive oil, melted butter, wine (if using) and the
 juice of half a lemon over the chicken, under the skin and
 inside the cavity. Season chicken liberally on the outside
 and inside the cavity with salt and pepper. Sprinkle over the
 parsley.
- 4. Rub the minced garlic over the chicken, mixing all ingredients together over the chicken and under the skin.
- 5. Stuff the garlic head into the chicken cavity along with the rosemary sprigs and the squeezed lemon halve. Tie legs together with kitchen string.
- 6. Place breast-side up into baking tray or roasting pan. Roast for 1 hour and 15-20 minutes, basting half way through cooking time, until juices run clear when chicken thigh is pierced with a skewer.
- 7. Baste again, then broil for a further 2-3 minutes, until golden.
- 8. Remove from the oven, cover with foil and allow to stand for 10 minutes before serving. Serve, drizzled with pan juices and remaining lemon half cut into wedges or slices.
