Say It Loud

Scripture: *Proverbs 31:8-9 (NIV)* - ⁸*SPEAK UP for those who cannot speak for themselves, for the rights of all who are destitute.* ⁹*SPEAK UP and judge fairly; defend the rights of the poor and needy.*

Infortunately, while we were called to be bold and stand up for some things, we also must be mindful of the environments in which we discuss certain things. About 30 years ago, a friend of mine told me that she doesn't discuss religion, race and politics in certain settings. I adopted this philosophy; however, I don't discuss religion, race, politics or sexual preference in most settings and with most people.

However, on Monday, January 30, 2022, at approximately 9:25am, I departed from this self-imposed policy. Five employees, including myself, were conversing after we completed a task. The group consisted of a white woman, a Hispanic man, two white men and myself. One of the white men asked the other white man "Have you seen the Tyre Nichols video?" They started talking about the video and I was about to walk away as I normally would do. However, I never moved.

Then the same white man says to the other white man "Now <u>THEY</u> can't bring race into it this time." Before I knew it, I said, "it is a race problem and it is a police problem." Then the other white man said, "Black Lives Matter is saying it is amazing how fast the black officers were fired and arrested, but it takes longer for white officers." Then he proceeded to say, "it normally only takes about 3 months for the investigations to be concluded." Again, before I knew it, I said "no actually it takes about 6-12 months for the investigation to be concluded which sometimes results in a slap on the wrist for the perpetrators." I could not let this situation take place and just walked away. I was professional and did not raise my voice, but they got the point. After about 10 minutes of speaking on the matter, I got in my vehicle and drove away. I know once I left, they called me all types of <u>NINJAS</u>, but I does not care.

If we do not speak out, our silence is just as complicit as the perpetrators and their supporters. We must "Say It Loud" for the homeless, the addicts, the handicap, children without parents, and anyone else that has been dealt a horrible hand in life.

We all have a voice and can "Say It Loud". A lot of us don't have a platform where we can speak to large audiences to deliver our message. However, we can still "Say It Loud" by voting for politicians who support police reform and overall justice for every human being on this earth.

Have you ever telephoned a business and got an automated voice telling you to press #1 for English, press #2 for another language, press #3 for another option or press #4 to leave a message? Have you ever made an appointment to visit the Maryland Motor Vehicle Administration? Well, you make the appointment, arrive at your appointed date and time just to stand in a line to get a number and then wait until your number is called.

Now imagine you are stepping into the presence of God. Remember, He is the Sovereign God who runs this entire universe. It would stand to reason that He would be super busy, right? So, it wouldn't be a surprise to see a sign saying, "Pick a number and wait for your turn."

But no! I can see Him turning around with a smile on His face that says, "Well, come on in. I've been waiting for you, Melissa (feel free to replace my name with yours)! What took you so long?" God knows my name.

You see, to our Heavenly Father, we are not just a number; we are not put on a wait list. He has redeemed us with the blood of His only begotten Son, Jesus Christ. Imagine, He calls each one of us by name! Like a mother calls her precious child. God knows my name.

How does it make you feel when someone calls you by your name? Get this, how about the fact that they even remembered your name? I can't speak for you, but it really makes me feel pretty good, kind of special, when someone remembers my name. He cares about me personally and deeply. God wants you to know how much He loves you. He loves you so much, that He gave His only begotten Son as a living sacrifice. God knows my name.

Let's Eat - Soup Recipe

Chicken Parm Soup



YIELD Serves 4-6 PREP TIME 15 mins.

COOK TIME 25 mins.

Ingredients

1 tbsp. extra-virgin olive oil

1 large onion, chopped

3 cloves garlic, minced

3 tbsp. tomato paste

1 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes

1 (15-oz.) can diced or crushed tomatoes

6 c. Swanson Chicken Broth

8 oz. penne pasta

3/4 lb. cooked chicken breast (about 2 breasts)

Let's be honest—who doesn't love chicken Parm? We've done our fair share of creative takes on the dinner, from chicken Parm pasta to chicken nugget Parm casserole, but when we're looking for an extracozy version, we turn to this soup recipe. Filled with everything you love about the Italian dish—chicken breasts, sharp Parm, and bright tomatoes—this soup version is perfect for the nights when you're craving the classic, but need something that'll warm up the soul. Plus it's ready in under 30 minutes, making it a much quicker (and easier) version when you need the same flavors, fast.

1.1/2 c. shredded mozzarella

1 c. freshly grated Parmesan

1 tbsp. freshly chopped parsley

Kosher salt

Freshly ground black pepper

Directions

- 1. In a large pot over medium heat, heat oil. Add onion and cook, stirring, until soft, 5 minutes. Add garlic and cook until fragrant, 1 minute more. Stir in tomato paste and red pepper flakes. Add tomatoes and broth and bring to a simmer.
- 2. Add penne and cook until al dente, 8 to 10 minutes.
- 3. Add chicken, mozzarella, Parmesan, and parsley and season generously with salt and pepper. Let cheese melt, then ladle into bowls.
