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
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Genesis 1:26–28 (*NKJV*)—²⁶Then God said, "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." ²⁷So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them. ²⁸Then God blessed them, and God said to them, "Be fruitful and multiply; fill the earth and subdue it; have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over every living thing that moves on the earth."

We are told that we have dominion in number 4. You already have this; it's not something you will acquire. You are the one who has it because of who you are in God.

I pray that the Greater Nation will implement numbers three and four by 2024.

I'M GOING THROUGH, Are You Too?

Isaiah 43:2 (NKJV)—When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; And through the rivers, they shall not overflow you. When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, Nor shall the flame scorch you.

Before I start, let me throw out a few names, Joseph, Job, Sara and Jesus. It will become clearer later on as to why I chose these names.

Each day, I see something that draws my attention. It usually has to do with an issue that is either mine or someone else's, who has spoken to me, or it could just be a word that springs forth out of a meditation.

I was lead to the passage because it contained the word that kept showing up. That word is through. Understand this, that word "through" has played a significant role in how I often minister to myself and others.

So let me say this to you right now, I'm going through, how about you? Let me ask once again, I'm going through, how about you? Many times when we go through rough periods that seem to impact us in a negative way, it is how we react to those periods. I have often asked myself, when is this going to end, how can I stop the bleeding? I have said, why me, what have I done to deserve this? I go to church, I pray, why is this happening to me? Have any of you ever done this?

Like I said earlier the phrase that kept popping up was, why am I going through this? It was right there and I couldn't see it because I was blinded by the trouble I was having at that time. That word through was the word that said it all. Can you just give me a few more minutes and I can tell you how it began to affect me and how it turned my sadness into a better livable way of thinking.

The word through is written a number of times in the scripture. It means, just like Isaiah wrote, you are going through, you are not standing still, in other words the time will pass because it is not permanent. When I understood what that meant, I gave a shout to the Lord. I was not stuck in a place that was going to be my permanent residence. Oh my goodness, that was such a relief. Just like the ad said, pop, pop, fizz, fizz - oh what a relief it is!

If you want more proof that troubles don't last always, let me tell you another story about how the Lord let me know He is there in good and bad times. In the Gospel of *Matthew 14th* Chapter, it tells of how Jesus fed the people and how He had been healing people. He was tired and He told the Apostles to pick up the leftovers and to get in the boat; He would see them later. He then went up on a mountain and while He was there praying, a storm arose.

Understand that while He was on the mountain, He could see everything that was going on. He was sitting high and looking low. Can you just close your eyes and envision Jesus looking down on your storm? I can better understand how my problems are like a storm. Jesus sees the storm in your life. He knows how it starts, He sees it in the middle and sees its end. Like many of us, including me, we think our storm will never end. However, if you just compare your storm to the storm that Jesus was looking down on and how He responded to the men on the boat, then you can see that you are never alone in your tribulations. He walked on the water to go to them and to calm their fears.

Just like the Prophet Isaiah wrote, no matter what you may be dealing with, no matter how hard the trial maybe, it is written that "I will be with you".

You can use an umbrella to protect yourself from the physical storm, just know that in your life's storm, God is your umbrella and He will see you through that storm. Just like storms began, they will end. Let me leave you with a few

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more tidbits. There was a song that the Winans sang. It says "Ain't no need to worry what the night is gonna bring, it will be all over in the morning".

As I listened to these words, it just resonated with my spirit and I heard some more words from another song. They go like this "*Morning by morning new mercies I see, all I have needed thy hand hath provided, great is thy faithfulness Lord unto me.*"

Let me just burden you for one more thought. See how trials never last, they just seem like it. See how God can see us through our hard times. If you want further proof of this, hear the words of the people in the book of *Lamentations 3rd* Chapter. You know what they had been going through, but they cried out to the Lord and these are the words they prayed; ²²Through the LORD's mercies we are not consumed, Because His compassions fail not. ²³They are new every morning; Great is Your faithfulness.

There's that word again," through". Let that be the word you think of and bolster yourself whenever you believe that there is no end to your storm. Remember the names of the people I told you about at the beginning of the scripture – Joseph, Job, Sara and Jesus? They are but a few of the people in the scripture whose stories tell us about their journeys. Their stories tell us of how they came through and the rewards they received. This should be a constant reminder to us too.

Remember storms don't last always!

Hebrews 11 (*NKJV*)—¹Now faith is the [a]substance of things hoped for, the [b]evidence of things not seen. ²For by it the elders obtained a good testimony. ³By faith we understand that the [c]worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.

Many of us had heard about the term faith long before we had a personal understanding of what faith means to us. Faith is not a tangible construct, yet it is an experience that all can have the benefit of much like God. As a child, we were taught about God and even may have seen the picture of Jesus as described by man. Yet, as we matured and came into a relationship with God, sometimes by choice and sometimes by force, we came to realize that our understanding and image of God, much like our attitude at times, is limited.

We learned in *Genesis* that we are created in His image. So that means that the presence and characteristics of God can't be summarized by one simple portrait of a singular man. Rather, every person that we come into contact with is also a reflection of the Father. This means that the vastness of God surpasses our understanding because of His greatness. This also means that there is a deepness in God to be experienced once we come to understand that He is truly all things at all times. Ubiquitous.

Gaining this understanding will help us to realize just how much we limit ourselves by boxing in our faith based upon what is familiar or comfortable to us. Yes, that means that at times our discomfort is based on our familiarity with the discomfort.

Yet, our faith has the capacity to experience the deepness of God in such a way that we can learn how to walk by faith and not by sight. It is in our walking, trusting and leaning on God's understanding that we get to experience the fullness of our faith no matter the circumstances.

We each will have storms, turmoil and rainbows at different times in our walk with God. Yet, when we activate our faith walk, then we are able to speak to our circumstances and expect the outcome to bless us indeed.

It is in our faith that we learn how to endure the ebbs and flows of this world. Our faith does not remove us from the chaos, rather it shields us because we are not operating in our own vain.

We know this to be true because verse 1 tells us that our faith is the substance of things hoped for. This means that there is some weight or added value to our hope. Our hope is not frivolous or without direction. Rather, our hope is headed in the direction of believing that God is who He says He is in spite of what we can see, think or imagine.

Think about your faith like this. No one can create yourself at the very beginning. We were formed with all of the intentions and goodness of God. Now, as we get older, God has to watched us grow and waited for us to choose Him. The substance of God's faith is that His creation would willing choose Him because of our need for Him.

When we choose Him, we have no idea of just how much better our lives will become. God's word never says that we are exempt from pain, strife, happiness or joy. Rather, in our faith walk, we can be of good cheer and courage in every circumstance because He is the I am that I am.

God being who He is, He gave us the creation of life all around us. For no matter how much artificial creations occur, we can't fake faith as it is an internal response to the connection of God inside of us. The evidence of our faith becomes the output in the lives of those we come into contact with.

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Oh yes, we were created in community and no matter how much we may think ourselves as separate, we truly are not. For the Word tells us that the body has many members and each member serves a specific function, as do our faith.

Our faith tells God that we trust Him and that He can trust us. Our faith tells others that we will not be tossed to and fro with the ups and downs of this world. Our faith tells us that we are believing in the One who created us, who formed us, who knows us and who loves us unconditionally. Our faith says that we are able to overcome but Jesus already overcame. Our faith says that we are not in control even when we want to be.

You see, faith requires us to believe even when we don't know how. That is why God provided the light for us to follow no matter what wilderness, valley or mountaintop experiences we may have. It is when we walk by God's faith that we truly understand verse 3.

³By faith we understand that the [c]worlds were framed by the word of God, so that the things which are seen were not made of things which are visible.

God framed everything and it is He who makes the invisible, visible. It is God who constructed our ability to have faith in Him to begin with. It is God who asks us to totally depend on Him for everything because in our dependence on Him, we have the substance to hope for the things that are yet to be seen.

Just remember that our hope was restored and redeemed in the sacrifice of Jesus and because of Him, we are the substance of things hoped for that we will reflect the one and true living God on this earth.

Let's Eat – Cake Recipe Butter Pecan Cake



PREP TIME 30 mins.

CHILL TIME COOK TIME 30 mins. 40 mins.

Ingredients

For the Cake:

1¼ cups and 3 tablespoons unsalted butter softened and divided (325g)
1½ cups chopped pecans (180g)
4¼ cups all-purpose flour (540g)
2½ teaspoons baking powder
1 teaspoon salt
3¼ teaspoon baking soda
2½ cups granulated sugar (500g)
5 large eggs room temperature
1 tablespoon vanilla extract
1¼ cup buttermilk room temperature (300ml)

For the Buttercream:

1½ cups unsalted butter softened (340g)
2 (8-ounce/227g) blocks cream cheese room temperature
½ teaspoon salt
7 cups powdered sugar (840g)
1 tablespoon heavy cream
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
½ cup toasted pecans finely chopped (60g)

Directions

- 1. In a skillet over medium heat, melt 3 tablespoons of butter. Add chopped pecans and cook, stirring occasionally, until toasted, 5 to 8 minutes. Transfer the toasted nuts to a small bowl and let cool completely.
- 2. Preheat the oven to 350°F. Grease 3 (9-inch) round cake pans with baking spray and line the bottoms with parchment paper. Wrap with water-soaked fabric baking scrips, if desired.
- 3. In a large bowl, whisk together the flour, baking powder, baking soda, and salt.

Butter Pecan Cake is moist, light, and nutty and topped with an irresistible cream cheese frosting! It is sure to delight all of the butter pecan lovers in your life. Make it for fall, special occasions, or just because!

- 4. In a large mixing bowl or the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment, beat the remaining 1¹/₄ cups butter and granulated sugar together until light and fluffy, 3 to 4 minutes.
- 5. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating until combined between each addition. Stop to scrape down sides as needed. Beat in the vanilla.
- 6. With the mixer on low speed, add a third of the flour mixture followed but half of the buttermilk. Repeat, alternating between the flour mixture and buttermilk until both are fully combined. Stop to scrape down the bowl occasionally. Fold in the cooled buttered pecans until evenly distributed. Divide the batter among the prepared cake pans.
- 7. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes, or until a wooden pick inserted into the center comes out with just a few crumbs. Let the cakes cool for 20 minutes in the pans. Invert onto cooling racks, remove the parchment paper, and let the cakes cool completely.


For the Buttercream:

- 1. In a large mixing bowl or the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, beat the butter, cream cheese, and salt together on medium speed until creamy and well combined, about 1 minute.
- 2. With the mixer on low speed, gradually add the powdered sugar. Stop occasionally and scrape down the bowl. Beat in the cream and vanilla. Once combined, increase the speed to medium-low and beat until smooth and fluffy, about 1 minute.

For the Assembly:

1. Place one cooled cake layer on a cake stand or serving plate. Top with 1 cup frosting, spreading smoothly out to the edges. Place another cake layer on top and repeat with 1 cup of frosting. Top with the final cake layer, and spread the remaining frosting all over the top and sides of the cake. Press finely chopped pecans around the bottom of the cake, and sprinkle any remaining on top of the cake around the edge. Chill for 30 minutes to set the frosting before serving. Cake can be covered and stored at room temperature or refrigerated for up to 5 days.
